

"Foundations of Global Harmony & Planetary Peace" Friday, October 6, - Sunday, October 8, 2023 Green Acre, Eliot, Maine

One Planet Peace Forum (OPPF) is pleased to announce that its 4th annual gathering will be held October 6-8, for the first time in-person at historic Green Acre on the Piscataqua River in Eliot, Maine. The weekend will include two hybrid sessions on Saturday afternoon that will be live streamed worldwide and a special world music celebration Saturday evening with Randy Armstrong and friends.

This year's theme, Foundations of Global Harmony and Planetary Peace, explores the questions: Why is race amity a prerequisite to world peace? How do inner harmony and fierce civility build peace? How is truth telling foundational to peace? How are contemplative and activist roles complementary in peacebuilding?

Initially funded by grants from United Religions Initiative (URI) and Maine Humanities Council, OPPF was created as an annual event to offer a universal platform for people of all backgrounds

to co-create solutions to humanity's most challenging issues. Its mission is to facilitate cooperative action toward building the future envisioned by the world's spiritual and wisdom traditions.

One Planet Peace Forum was inspired by the vision of Sarah Farmer. After attending the first Parliament of the World's Religions in 1893, she founded the Green Acre Conferences at the resort hotel on the Piscataqua River where she was a partner and invited Swami Vivekananda and oneplanetpeaceforum.org

other spiritual teachers from the East and West to speak. The first program was dedicated to the ideals of peace. She raised the world's first known Peace Flag at Green Acre in 1894.

With a holistic approach to peace making, OPPF strives to build bridges that will unite the human family. Since humanity must heal its ailments before it can achieve wholeness, unity, and peace, the path to peace is seen as crossing many steppingstones as prerequisites for the age-old vision of peace on earth.

This universal vision of the world's sacred traditions will be the result of a steady and committed process of applying unitive principles to create infrastructures on all levels of society, from local to global, that will sustain lasting peace in the world.

Co-produced by Good of the Whole and the Connection Field, with Dr. Julie Krull, host of All Things Connected, as moderator and emcee, the program starts Friday, October 6 at 5pm and concludes Sunday, the 8th after lunch. It will include special musical performances Friday and Saturday nights.
